


1 - Mark Montovio – Judge II

Mark studied Fine Arts, focusing on sculpture, dance and photography at Loughborough University and at L'Université d'Orléans in Paris. Over the last thirty years, Mark has combined a number of materials to create work that brought together the three disciplines, and the focal point has often been an initial reaction to specific materials, the ensuing dialogue, and an attempt to process life experiences and challenges. Mark is also a therapeutic counsellor, with a strong existential philosophy, and this often contributes to the development of specific pieces.


3 - Gail Francis-Tiron – Marine Doodle




5 - Beatrice Garcia – St Paul's Cathedral


9 - Wanda Bush - Día

This artwork was painted in soft Sennelier pastels and harder Rembrandt pastels, with Bruynzeel and CarbOthello pastel pencils, and painted on grey tinted Derwent textured paper. The piece is a view from the top of the Rock, looking north down the east side slope, with the old water catchments now returned to nature. This view was originally sketched en plein air on a sketch book, and then recreated and reproduced with the help of a photograph.


